Local Council Award Scheme - Foundation

PLANNING AND LICENSING MATTERS

Alfreton Town Council has a Planning Committee, which considered **29** Planning Applications in the Town and passed on 2 objections and 2 observations to Amber Valley Borough Council, the Planning Authority.

The Planning Committee is keen to ensure the growth of Alfreton as a vibrant shopping and residential town without compromising the quality of life of residents or the historical and conservation needs.

The Council is actively involved in the application for a ‘Village Green’ on the Outseat’s Farm site.

ALFRETON STATION AND TRAIN SERVICES THROUGH ALFRETON

The Town Council met with representatives of Network Rail and East Midlands Trains in March 2015, where they were told that Alfreton is 1 of 3 stations approved for funding in the next years on the DfT Priority list, worked on hierarchy and needs which have been approved by DfT in their next 'round of funding'.

Surveys of station due to start in April 2015 to determine location of footbridge

Initial designs October 2015

Public meeting November 2015

Design period and start by March/April 2016

Complete by Dec 2016

ALFRETON BUS STATION.

Alfreton Town Council is responsible for the sweeping of the bus station and cleaning of the shelters. The Grounds and Maintenance Operative carries out the sweeping and contractors undertake the specialist cleaning which the Town Council pays for.

The Town Council have contacted Trent Buses to hold a public meeting in Alfreton regarding the re-routing of the 'Nines' buses along Grange Street.

TOUR OF THE TOWN

PROPERTIES:

Alfreton House

Alfreton Town Council maintains and manages Alfreton House which is the oldest property in Alfreton. Due to the age of the building increased running costs are incurred by The Council.

The building is used for all Council Meetings and events, along with rooms within the house being let to commercial tenants. The Council Chamber is let out at an affordable rate. CCTV has been installed along with an updated alarm and security system.

War Memorial

Alfreton Town Council organised alongside the Royal British Legion, a parade and church service for Remembrance Sunday. This was attended by over 2000 people and was a very successful event. Road closures were in place, supported by the Police to ensure the safety of the public.

ALLOTMENTS

Alfreton Town Council is the owner of 4 Allotment Sites. They are under the management of individual allotment associations. Alfreton Town Council will continue to support those associations so that they can offer allotments at a reasonable rent.

SUMMER AND WINTER PLANTING SCHEMES

The Town Council provides and maintains planting schemes throughout the Town, particularly the grounds of Alfreton House and the House of Confinement. The Garden and Maintenance Operative also maintains the planters at Alfreton Railway Station, Alfreton Grange Arts College, opposite the Watchorn Church on Derby Road and at the War Memorial site.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS AND SWITCH ON EVENT

In 2014 the Town once again had an attractive set of Christmas Lights which included a traditional Christmas tree with a modern lighting display on the High Street and a modern artificial Christmas Tree at Alfreton House, refurbished to a new brighter LED display. A Christmas Lights Switch On Event was held at Alfreton House raising money for various charities which was very successful, another event is planned for 2015.
